

Installing Tasks on a Windows network

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You can install Tasks across your Windows network at your company, school or university. You simply need to write one of the following keys to the registry:

If Google Chrome is your default web browser:

Windows Registry Editor Version 5.00

```
[HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Policies\Google\Chrome\WebAppInstallForceList]
"82934"="{\"create_desktop_shortcut\": true,\"default_launch_container\": \"window\", \"url\": \"https://tasks.everway.com/\", \"fallback_app_name\": \"Tasks\", \"install_as_shortcut\": true}"
```

And if Microsoft Edge is your default web browser:

Windows Registry Editor Version 5.00

```
[HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Policies\Microsoft\Edge\WebAppInstallForceList]
"82934"="{\"create_desktop_shortcut\": true,\"default_launch_container\": \"window\", \"url\": \"https://tasks.everway.com/\", \"fallback_app_name\": \"Tasks\", \"install_as_shortcut\": true}"
```

You can deploy these keys via Group Policy or other network management tools.

The installation will not take effect until the browser (Edge or Chrome) is restarted - so users might have to log in and and out to see Tasks in the Start menu.
